Mr. John Kane who purchased this item from a dealer in Chestnut Hill while their family lived in the Elliger Park section of Fort Washington. It is now hanging in our entrance hallway. •

It should be comforting to know that your dues as a member help in this effort.

**Trustees** are members who volunteer to serve in this capacity for a four year term. We make the decisions on accepting historic donations, selecting tenants/caretakers, and all work and improvements to preserve *Clifton House*. Current **Trustees** are listed on the last page of this newsletter.

We had a building inspection performed by Building Consultants, Inc. in the fall of 2016. The report indicated a general good condition for a building of this age but also items in need of improvement. The areas of highest priority were upgrading the electrical to bring it up to code and landscape changes to keep water away from the building.

The electrical work is near completion and includes improved lighting in the museum areas. Still to be done is exterior lighting to highlight the building for security and to bring more attention to the building. The Caretakers/tenant's third floor apartment also received a badly needed new coat of paint. More painting of the 2nd and 3rd floor hallways is planned. Also planned, when the weather improves in the Spring, is a fresh coat of paint for the building's large front porch/entrance way.

The overgrown shrubs and bushes have been nicely cut back and are no longer against the building. Additionally the window wells were deepened to keep water away from the windows and a berm created,

behind the building, to divert runoff water from the hill, away from the building.

Future plans include power washing the exterior for mold remediation and eventual exterior wood repair and repainting. We are also looking into a backup sump pump system to prevent basement flooding in the event of a power failure and improvements to the driveway and parking area.

We have a wonderful historic building to use, but to maintain *Clifton House* many hands are required. Please consider volunteering as the needs arise. ❖
